Thank you stamp savers. Keep saving stamps for the Wounded Veterans. Drop off in the office for Skip Rhodes.


APOSTLES CARING CARTS

New Campaign to Forgive Lancaster County Medical Debt

21 Churches, members of the Parish Resource Center (Apostles UCC is one of them), are launching a campaign to Forgive Lancaster County Medical Debt. The campaign aims at raising \$31,000. That \$31,000. will FORGIVE 31 Million Dollars of medical debt. This will help an estimated 4,000 families in Lancaster County by eliminating this burden. Medical debt is a debt of necessity which can affect anyone. It shows up on credit rating reports which are used by landlords, and employers to determine who can rent an apartment, or get a job. Of all debt "in collections", half is medical debt.

RIP Medical Debt is a non-profit organization which negotiates with collection agencies to buy medical debt. (see www.ripmedicaldebt.org)
They researched and discovered the \$3.1 million of medical debt on sale for \$31,000. The Parish Resource Center heard about this opportunity, and asked Lancaster Churches to respond. Apostles said YES!

Between now and April 30, 2020, you will be asked to contribute to this campaign. Your check toward this effort should be made out to **Church of the Apostles, with "medical debt forgiveness"** on the memo line. Some of the 21 Continued on page 7

Churches currently involved in this effort, have pledged \$2,000., and some already have started campaigns.

Some of the churches are small and fear they may not reach that mark. Others, like Church of Apostles, have a history of meeting, and exceeding, such goals. (Yea, us)

If wiping out \$3.1 million of medical debt for \$31,000 seems too good to be true, and you want to know more, look for both a **one page summary, "Lancaster Churches Forgiving Medical Debt in Lancaster County"**, and a 5 page document , **"Partner with RIP Medical Debt"** in the church lobby. ■
