A Note from the President

Have you ever been driving in your new car and suddenly realize how many just like yours are on the road? All of sudden everywhere you turn you see a car that's the same as the one you just purchased. You probably hadn't noticed that make or model or color before, but now its all you see. Well, over the past week or so, I had heard the phrase "change of heart" multiple times. Then driving past the church, it was on the board out front. It was obviously speaking to me that I needed to sit with it and explore why the phrase would not leave me alone. It was begging to be my next message for you all, even though it was easily one week before the deadline. Which means it was 6 days and 12 hours before I would sit and write my next message. I tend to procrastinate when it comes to the Crown articles, because for me they are the hardest part of being the President of Council. Don't get me wrong, I always love the finished product...but it is a struggle for me to get there.

So, I sat my nerdy self down and I did a little research on the idiom "change of heart" to see where and when it originated from. If I was meant to see something in this phrase, then I needed to know it from the beginning. A "change of heart" is simply to change your opinion on a matter. Typically that shift happens quickly, leading to a "sudden change of heart." The phrase itself dates back to anywhere from 1600-1800's but cannot be confirmed, however is used in Jane Austin's writings in 1813, specifically Pride and Prejudice. So it would have been a common enough phrase by then to be relatable to her readers. The word "change" has a much longer history and can be dated back to the 1200's where it originally meant to alter or exchange. In the 1300's however, it had taken on the meaning to undergo alteration or become different. This "newer" meaning is a more plausible use of the word change in the idiom "change of heart."

I do not like this idiom. My view is in order to have a

change of heart, one must have already made up their mind, realized for one reason or another that the stance they took was not in their best interest and decided to switch their view. The place that they land is like a consolation, in that the gut reaction led the person in another direction. It places the emphasis on the decision making process and not feelings of the matter.

What if we were looking at this all wrong? What if the last 200-400 hundred years we had been emphasizing the wrong word? Instead of a "change of heart" what if we had a "heart of change?" How does that alter your perception of the phrase? What if we listened to the Spirit within us and strive to live a more "Christ-like" life? In John 14:17, he says "He is the Holy Spirit, who leads into all truth. The world cannot receive him, because it isn't looking for him and doesn't recognize him. But you know him, because he lives with you now and later will be in you." Anytime there are alterations to your life it is scary and uncomfortable. But if the focus is to look outward for solace during the tough times, we will never give our intellect the opportunity to be on the same page as the Spirit that lies within us. We need to look inward, and listen, for God will guide us. What could the world look like if we had a "Heart of Change?" When we allow God to guide us, we have no need for fear. At that point any change in life we encounter is simply a "year 1200" use of the word...an exchange...a simple swap. Just like when you buy a new car and trade in the old one. And I bet you'll see it everywhere you go!


Giving Report• February 2020

Mr. Rogers said in times of crisis to look for the helpers. And in the past few months, I've seen many helpers at Church of the Apostles. Members writing notes to people in nursing homes who can no longer have physical visitors. Members wondering how best to use our resources like our Food Bank to help others in the community. Members calling others who might be feeling anxious about what's going on with the pandemic and connecting in positive ways via social media.

On a personal note, I have had two serious family issues recently. My mom and her husband took seriously ill on vacation in Florida. Without much notice, I had to fly down there to drive them back home. That meant I was unable to meet some major commitments at the church, but others quickly agreed to cover for me. During their recovery period, I have had numerous people reach out to express concern and to let me know they were in their prayers.

As Sam's pregnancy progressed, she was often approached by members asking how she was and if they could help. The congregation reached out with restaurant gift cards as part of the New Mom's Support Group. When her baby was born, there were complications and he was airlifted to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He was surrounded in prayer by members of the church. I had a number of people reach out to me expressing their support and concern. He is home now and all appears well. Thank you all.

Church of the Apostles members have clearly shown they are a family of believers and we are definitely the helpers that Mr. Rogers spoke about. We are following Christ's example to support one another and to work to make this world a peaceful and just world.

Ways to be a Helper. . .

As we continue to navigate through uncharted waters during the COVID-19 pandemic, we are exploring ways to stay engaged with our church & community to offer spiritual, temporal and emotional support.

Below are some suggestions from Cathy Kenlin and others to be a Helper in today's world of social distancing:

- Send a card or short note to someone who may not get visitors or who may be living alone
- Donate to a local food bank
- Buy a takeout meal or gift card from your favorite restaurant
- Call & tell someone that you are thinking about them
- Give blood
- Write a letter to your local elected officials about a cause that is important to you
- Say a prayer for someone else
- Pickup groceries, or run another errand, for someone who shouldn't leave their house
- Pick up trash or litter when you take a walk
- Buy a child a book
- Pay for someone behind you in the drive-thru
- Choose a positive attitude try to find the good in everything and everyone
- Thank someone for something they've done for you or someone else
- Send a thank you note to your local Emergency Dept.
- Pick up your church directory and randomly call 3 people to see how life is going for them right now.
- Pray individually or start a phone prayer chain to pray that an effective vaccine for the coronavirus will be created, for the health and well-being of everyone.
- Stay in touch with the pulse of the worshipping church community by going online and listening to the Sunday worship service or other reflective programming COA web site at https://apostlesucc.org/sermons/
- Set a time for a "wave party" and invite your neighbors to come to their porch or driveway and wave, sing, dance to music, etc.






Flowers for Worship Form

Fellow Apostles and Siblings in Christ,

Our time together is drawing to a close, and it is a bittersweet time. The future is surely filled with much possibility, and as exciting as that can be, there is also uncertainty and loss involved in any transition. It is natural, when on the precipice of something new, to want to reflect on the exact meaning of what came before, so she can, with open eyes, remember the past with fondness and learn valuable lessons for the sake of the future. Accordingly, I hope you will indulge me in using this letter to reflect a bit, for my own sake and for the sake of Church of the Apostles.

Nothing can be said without first saying that I have loved and cherished my time at Church of the Apostles, both as an inter*in* and as an inter*im*. Apostles will always be the environment that trusted me with enough freedom to truly get to know what a calling for church ministry looks and feels like. Because of my time here, I can confidently say that I have no doubts as to my calling for this work. I have preached, presided, written, prayed, visited, led, taught, counseled, listened, played, sung, and reported. I participated both in baptisms and in funerals. I have laughed with those of you who laughed and wept with those of you who wept. It is not always easy work, but there is always joy in it. I hope, if nothing else, I was able to communicate that in the way I conducted myself among you.

I will miss the people. Along the way I have made connections with many of you. It is such a humbling and extraordinary thing we ministers are entrusted to do: to befriend people, some of whom are quite unlike us. It is a grace given unto me that is hard to describe, but if I had to try, I'd say it's a bit like the way Pastor Kathy talks about the communion table: something happens wherein the divisions between us seem to vanish and we are just children of God praying in a hospital room, studying the Acts of the Apostles, singing a hymn, or sharing a pot of tea. The writer of the epistle to the Ephesians proclaims that Christ has "broken down the dividing wall" between peoples. After nearly two years among you, I can confirm that sentiment.

Of course, the latter half of our journey together was not without challenge. We cannot pretend otherwise. I like to think, however, that we are all the better for it. Despite some hurt feelings along the way, the feeling I am mostly left with is one of gratitude. I am grateful that Church of the Apostles offered a safe place for me to truly begin my ministry, embodied correctly. I am grateful for the many of you who offered words of affirmation and support, for those of you who struggled but did so in love, and for all of you that stayed and remained part of a united body, despite the many differing opinions on the matter. My hope for you is that you not forget this time. I pray it can be formative for you as it was for me, that it inspires the kinds of ministries or messages that develop. I pray that this is not merely the end of something for you, but the beginning. Church of the Apostles has, for as long as I've known it, prided itself on its personable hospitality. I now know firsthand that this famous hospitality is capable of welcoming the stranger and the outcast. I wish you many fruitful years of doing just that, as you, along with the church universal, seek to be the church Christ intends us to be, little by little, step by step. May God bless and keep you.
