This year the Stewardship Commission also encouraged you to complete a survey indicating where your priorities are within the church. I want to strongly encourage you to take these pieces seriously as we seek to define our life as a body of Christ.

Our culture encourages us to assess the value of church donations from a personal perspective — "What am I getting out of this?" However, I suggest a more faithful perspective would be — "How can I help to ensure others hear the word of salvation available here?" The nature of worship is to be about offering God our praise and the nature of our work is to be about sharing the good news of Christ with others. As Apostles we are to be "theocentric," with God as the center of our being and our work.

Salvation is not a topic frequently discussed in our denomination as so many of us were literally "born into the faith." But in this world where more and more adults have had no church experience other than those using scare tactics, do we not have a message of love and acceptance for those who wish to know more about Jesus? Might this be the time when we as a "mainline" protestant church with all theological perspectives from liberal to conservative reach out to those struggling to make sense of their lives in Lancaster and say, "Come as you are ... hurt or discouraged, lonely or lost. You are welcome at Church of the Apostles."

May we continue to be a place of refuge, a place of hope, and a place of peace in our hurting world!

#### **COUNCIL MINUTES**

September 23, 2013

**Devotions:** Pastor Kuhn shared a devotion from Lillian Daniels about a cat who walked by faith not by sight. (II Corinthians) She encouraged us to do the same

**Minutes:** Andy/Tom motioned that the minutes be approved as written.

**Treasurers Report:** Revenues exceeded expenses by approximately \$4000. Spending less than last year. Giving is down \$25,000 from last year. This financial picture is a huge improvement from previous years. Steve encouraged us all to reach out to those who aren't attending presently. Andy asked if there is a list of those who are not attending.

**Executive:** Is beginning to consider bonuses for our employees. The marketing plan proposed by George is being discussed but some are concerned about the work that needs to be done within the church before reaching out to new membership.

#### **Old Business:**

**Commission Change:** Erika Neiderer will be joining Parish Life.

Bylaws: The majority of the council meeting was spent discussing and approving 12 changes to the proposed bylaws. This included having the Pastoral Relations Committee being addressed in the Policy and Procedures manual with this language: "Church of the Apostles is committed to providing a pastoral relations committee for any pastor who chooses to have one. Five members will be chosen by the pastor and approved by council to provide counsel and support to the pastor. The members will determine the form and frequency of their meetings."

A vote was taken to send the revised version to the congregation for its consideration and it passed 12/2 with one abstention.

There will be three opportunities for the congregation to ask questions and give feedback about both the bylaws and budget. Those times are: Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup> 9:15-11:15, Wednesday, October 9<sup>th</sup> 1:30-2:30 and 6-7pm. Council is welcome to continue giving input during these sessions.

**Jane McCartney** is our laity volunteer of the year. Congratulations Jane!

#### **New Business:**

**Council Meeting Place:** Council will be meeting in the parlor because the sanctuary will be occupied in

the upcoming months.

**CIA-Commission Interaction Activity:** Commissions will be meeting October 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 in Fellowship Hall to eat and interact. Come with an open mind and expect to get out of your comfort zone!

#### **Reports from Pastor, Staff and Commissions:**

**Cathy:** Worship design team is going to have a retreat at Cathy Kenlin's house from 10-3 on September 28<sup>th</sup>. **Julie:** passed around a sign-up sheet for soup production.

**Andy:** We have passed the \$10,000 goal for the school in Honduras! Any additional funds will help with the shipping costs of desks. The school is already named but COA will have a building named after it. On a "to be determined date" a video will be shown at both services and a ceremonial check will be presented from the congregation. There will be information on CARE's website about going to Honduras the last week in January for the dedication. The walk/run fundraiser will be on October 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Karen:** welcomed Erika to Parish life. There will be a hayride for Trunk or Treat, Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup>. Karen will be starting a "Want Ad" section in the Crown for volunteers.

George: Pledge campaign will be starting soon. A questionnaire will be part of the process with the pledge cards and there will be 5 weeks of stewardship moments. The budget is in draft form and George noted that it has been decreasing the past five years. He discussed a marketing program that would focus on the prevalence of stress in society as a whole. "Stressed/Burned Out? God will listen." Materials (post cards) would refer to our website and programming...yoga, basketball.

Steve: asked about the bridge that was being repaired in Rader Park. One of the neighbors has donated \$1500 towards the bridge.

**Tom Flory:** Tom removed his motion from the previous council meeting and shared that he will be moving to Portland in 10 days. He will be missed. Godspeed Tom! **Jane:** Wishing Well Christmas project this year will be to fill backpacks and send to the children at the new school in Honduras.

**Cindy Williams:** asked about the shelving for the refrigerators. Property is looking into it.

**Worship:** Asked for council to show its support for the combined Christmas Eve service at 7 pm. The majority thought it is a good idea but emphasized the importance of balancing the new cantata with traditional aspects of our previous Christmas Eve services.

**Don Freeman** commented on our mixed responses to the proposed bylaws and encouraged us to keep working.

Meeting adjourned 9:20 pm.

# Celebrating Local Children's Writers: Heritage & Horizons & On the Horizon Welcome Sandy Asher and Amanda Kemp Tuesday, November 5

Calling all who love literature – all who love the theater – all who love children – all who love Lancaster County – and especially all who love some combination of these four: our upcoming morning of **Celebrating Local Children's Writers** is an event you won't want to miss!

On Tuesday, November 5, Heritage & Horizons, the adult learning division of Apostles Academy of Arts & Sciences, welcomes *local children's author Sandy Asher and local children's playwright Amanda Kemp*. This special "On the Horizon" event will conclude the Fall 2013 "All About Lancaster County" season of Heritage & Horizons. In addition to free child care and refreshments included with your paid registration, Ms. Asher will have signed copies of several of her works available for sale, at a specially discounted price, during the break. (Start making your Christmas shopping lists now!)

Ms. Asher has written over two dozen books for young readers, including the award-winning *Too Many Frogs!*, and edited five anthologies, including *With All My Heart, With All My Mind*, winner of the National Jewish Book Award for children's literature. She has also written several dozen plays, many of them for young audiences. Dr. Kemp is artistic director of Theatre for Transformation, a Lancaster-based company she founded that tours plays about African-American history for schools, colleges, and other community settings. TFT's plays have received awards from the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, and other organizations.

Asher and Kemp will tell stories of their careers writing for children and answer audience questions. Those who have not yet participated in our fall series may register on a walk-in basis, beginning at 9:15, for the special one-day price of only \$5 per adult. Please join us in the sanctuary on Tuesday, November 5 from 9:30-11:45 am for this special event!

# Outreach

#### C.A.R.E. !!!

In a little over two months, the congregation of Church of the Apostles raised enough money to build a school in rural Honduras for about 50 students. A remarkable achievement, even more so when the total raised was over \$11,000.00!

Working with a Lancaster based charity, Central American Relief Efforts [CARE], through its executive director and Apostles church council member Andy Appel, Church of the Apostles will provide the shelter for these students who have been learning outdoors, using rocks and stumps as their chairs and desks. The two room school will be an enormous improvement for the students and a source of pride for the remote and impoverished village of Los Ranchos de Esquimay. The villagers, helping to make this a reality, are "finishing" the last 1/2 mile of "road" to their village that will then allow four wheel drive vehicles to get to them, bringing the supplies for the school that otherwise would have been delivered by horse [and human] back.

The project has captured the imagination of Church of the Apostles. Nate Sheffer is writing a song the Children's Choir will record [in Spanish] for the schoolchildren at the school. The Advent project will provide a backpack, filled with school supplies [and more essentials] for each child. The Turtle Project is sending a personalized turtle-with a message for each student--prepared by Sunday School classes.

Kristi Philips, who works for CARE, will be in Honduras in later October and will be visiting the village where the school is being built. She's going to bring the name and age of each child back for our projects. Pictures will be posted at church as they become available so we can track the progress during construction.

And the last big excitement is......a group from Church of the Apostles will go to Honduras from January 26 through January 31. The trip will start with the dedication of the school! Church of the Apostles will be permanently recognized at the school. Those on the trip will assist in two medical clinics at rural villages, visit children at an orphanage and experience the warmth of the Honduran people. Pastor Kathy has information about the trip if you are interested. Andy Appel, Pastor Kathy and Nate Sheffer are leading the group!

Please contact Pastor Kathy Kuhn if you are interested in joining those going to experience one of the most satisfying and heart-warming times in their lives!!

#### Wishing Well

Our last **Wishing Well** ministry, to support the Apostles Assistance Fund, was a huge success! Pastor Kuhn will be able to assist many people with the wonderful supplies which we collected. Many thanks to all of you generous givers!

I am really excited about our Holiday project which will be to provide the fifty Honduran students and teachers with backpacks filled with school supplies to get them started on the right foot in their new school! I am so proud of COA for raising the funds for this school in Honduras! As always, I am proud to be a member of such a giving congregation! Once again, this Holiday project will be in partnership with the Preschool. The Preschool has always been very generous in helping us with our Holiday ministries. We are doing this project a bit differently than we did two years ago when we filled backpacks for Head Start. This year the congregation will fill 25 backpacks and the preschool will fill the other 25. The congregation will fill ours at the Advent workshop on December 1st. Once again, there are two display boards with information on the specific items needed. One board is above the Wishing Well (in the cloak room) and the other is on the Outreach bulletin board in the Narthex. Please choose an item or items to donate and return them to the well by Sunday, November 24th. That will give us time to sort them out for the production line at the workshop. I think that it will be very exciting to spread Holiday cheer all the way to Honduras and give these students,

not only the school, but the supplies needed to provide them with the education they deserve! Thank you so much! Any questions? — please see Jane McCartney.
