From the Pastor...

For this year, I am challenging our Council and their sub-committees (Ministry Planning Committee, Growth Task Force, Koinonia, and Executive Committee) to explore how we can live into the statement created by our Search Committee when answering the question, “Who is God calling us to be?” Our answer to this question is “God is calling us to be a welcoming and loving multi-generational, diverse community exhibiting generous hospitality in an increasingly challenging world.” This reads like a vision statement for which we have been listening and waiting to emerge. It names an “end product” that we can see ourselves becoming as we fulfill our mission of “Sharing Christ’s Love with All People.” So it is my hope and plan for us to begin questioning if what we do meets this vision.

Our Growth Task Force is looking at three questions to help us meet this vision. They are: How can the church become more welcoming? How can the church exhibit generous hospitality? How can the church attract new visitors and members? Hopefully, these questions sound familiar as they were on the tables for your thoughts during our 2018 Annual Meeting. We are using your thoughts and the information we have about our neighborhood to make suggestions and create long-range goals for our congregation. The members of our Growth Task Force are Earl Cardellino, Don Hess, Nancy Hungerford, Tom Lewis, and Hannah Royer.

One of the ways I think we can meet this goal is to become a more relational community. In other words, I am suggesting we work on intentionally building relationships within our congregation and with those in our neighborhood. That will begin with a challenge of connecting with our membership through phone calls or visits just to learn what is happening in our lives and hear more of what the greater community (including our neighborhood) needs from our church. We hope you will see this as a positive step toward being a more closely affiliated congregation.

Giving Report for December

The cash flow for month ending December 31, 2018 was negative (\$73,572.06) for the entire year 2018. Same time last year was negative (\$130,970.75). Operating Expenses through December 2018 were \$594,171.75, Revenue \$520,599.69. Same time last year \$603,544.02 for Expenses, \$472,573.27 for Revenue. Revenue this year included non-recurring special gifts and bequests. We began the year with \$2,007,454.38 in endowment funds and the end December balance was \$1,735,053.61 which includes a market loss of \$109,496.17 in December.

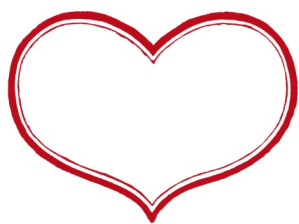
Outreach

Search for Associate

Update on the progress for the search for our Associate Minister

In July, 2018, a Search Committee met for the first time to start the process of bringing an Associate Minister to Church of the Apostles. That committee has the following members: Mic Bender, Allison Carr, Christa DiDomenico, Jean Heidig, John Hess, Linda Lewis, Alexa Neiderer, Mark Reinhardt, Karen Youtz, Pastor Kuhn and Andy Appel, Chair.

Over the course of the next five months, the committee met on a regular basis to research, analyze, organize and complete the required "LOCAL CHURCH PROFILE" that is submitted to Penn Central Conference of the United Church of Christ. This document, fifty pages in length, presents a detailed picture of Church of the Apostles touching on numerous topics that help an applicant learn about us. The profile has been accepted and filed at Penn Central Conference and notice of our intent to hire an Associate Pastor was publicized on January 16, 2019.

Interested applicants will be responding to the notice and receive more detailed information from Penn Central Conference. In the [hopefully] not too distant future, we will begin to receive information on those expressing their interest in us. The Search Committee will meet on a regular basis as received applications will be reviewed in groups. Depending on the number of applications received, then how many of those will be further reviewed, will the Search Committee schedule personal interviews for applicants who appear the best prospects.

The application process is complicated---and confidential. The Search Committee will keep the Congregation informed of progress on a regular basis, in the detail allowed while preserving the integrity of the process.

This is a very exciting time for the future of Church of the Apostles. The Committee has worked very hard to allow our church the opportunity to partner with the best person available. We thank your patience.
