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

Giving Report for January 2019

The cash flow for month ending January 31, 2019 was negative (\$6,502.21) for the month. Same time last year was positive \$26,932.76. Operating Expenses through January 2019 were \$46,569.18, Revenue \$40,066.97. Same time last year \$31,142.30 for Expenses, \$58,075.06 for Revenue. We began the year with \$2,007,454.38 in endowment funds and the end

December balance was \$1,735,053.61 which included a market loss of \$109,496.17. Market loss was partially recovered and after \$82,376.49 draw including \$70,272.04 repayment of 2018 deficit the end

Devotions: Christa Conrad led devotions sharing the words of "You Say, I Believe" followed by prayer.

Minutes: minutes from the December 17, 2018 meeting were *corrected* regarding spelling of Betsy

Bischoff's name, and **approved as corrected**, on motion of John Eshbach, second by Jeannie Clausen.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Reinhardt reported that the income for 2018 exceeded the projections. Expenditures were below projections. Consequently, a smaller amount was drawn from investment income to balance the budget for the year.

Process for requests for payment was reviewed, along with where to find forms, codes for expenditures, and who signs where.


Stewardship: as in packet.

Bernie Fickes has records of what the Decorations Team has done since 2003, and will share those notes, and offer support to a new team as it is formed. The Commission dreams of having more groups within the church see the learning and service opportunities in caring for the appearance of the sanctuary which enhances our worship experience.

Pastor's Report - as in packet. Kathy shared copies of Dan Dorsey's report which was not included in the Packet. She called our attention to four (4) subcommittees of Council. Plan calendar of activities to encourage collaboration. church (2) Growth Task Force: minutes appear monthly in packet following Sr. Pastor Report. Meetings announced in the Church calendar. Jeannie Clausen is contact person. (4) Executive Committee serves as Personnel Committee interviewing and hiring staff; participating in staff reviews.

New Business: Search Committee has completed Church Profile, and it has been published by Penn Central Conference on the UCC Website. Their next task is to review applicant profiles as they arrive. **Covenant Policy 601.** The policy in its entirety read aloud by the Council. Discussion reviewed: how policy was developed, how it was used in the past: how it might be used now: emotions evoked by it: could/ should it be reworded, refreshed; how to use the concepts stated within it. Discussion of need to develop stronger bonds within Congregation: could council members set example by intentionally calling members of Congregation to express desire to know member better, have member know us, if they are willing. Need for conversation starters for the "phone spastic" to be sent to Council electronically. Agreed: Each council member will undertake calling 4 members a month. participating denominations in this effort. The donation from Church of the Apostles to OGHS is pooled with UCC funds and is used for the purposes noted earlier as well as the sudden, unanticipated emergencies that occur worldwide.

In 2017, approximately 65% of UCC congregations donated about \$2,000,000. Donated funds were used for mission support including: health care education and sustainable agricultural development. Disaster relief and refugee support in the United States received financial support as well.

Book Club



Traveling Together

Our Lenten theme this year is one of a pilgrimage. The worship series is entitled "The Way" based on a movie by that title which is about a father who walks the Camino de Santiago and the companions he meets along the way.
