Letter from the President

The season of Lent began last month and my Facebook feed was inundated with all of my friends stating what they were giving up. Call to Order: 7:10 pm by Christa Conrad, President **Devotions:** Todd Harris led devotions and prayer. **Minutes:** minutes from the January 21, 2019 meeting were **approved**, on motion of Jeannie Clausen, second by Donna Carr.

Treasurer's Report: Finances holding steady. There was a gift from Jan Reed of \$900,000 which is undesignated. This will cushion expenses for building upgrades and staffing. Discussion highlights the goal of growing the membership.

Commission Reports:

MPC: Request that members of Council check the new Calendar of major events posted in the office on the wall between the main office and Financial Coordinator's office. MPC meetings are scheduled in April, June and September.

Education: as in packet. Heritage and Horizons is planning a spring series. Green Team is sponsoring the Parish Resource Center's Retreat "Sacred Spaces" on March 9, 2019 here in Fellowship Hall. Details are in March CROWN.

Outreach: as in packet.

Parish Life: as in packet. A seminar "Mindful Eating" is scheduled for Saturday, February 23. Members were reminded of the Garage Sale scheduled for April 26, 27, and needed Hands to sort, price, and sell.

Property: highlight Eagle Scouts Jack and Justin Thomas will undertake to build a 4 foot in diameter Fire pit, and four benches surrounding it in the Pine Tree Circle at Rader Park. Marty and Herb have been trimming the pine trees in preparation. Eric will be in contact with the Scouts as the project proceeds.

Stewardship: as in packet, and Treasurer's report. **Worship:** Change in time of meetings: **First Tuesday of Month at 7:30.** The Worship Design Team meets at 7 pm in the Choir Room, and the Commission meeting will follow. Bernie shared the outcome of her meeting

with the Youth Group to explain the responsibilities of the Worship Commission. She gained a reader and an usher.

Pastor's Report – as in packet. Pastor Kuhn made Council aware of Dan's upcoming academic Schedule. He has a "clinical cycle" in April, and a trip in May for a "cross-cultural" experience, meaning several weeks absence from duties with us. At the end of July, he begins a new Internship. She notes that **Rader Park** has been named "**Lancaster's Best Small Park for 2019**". Members shared ideas for celebrating this, as well as the fact that our building itself is 40 years old this year. In addition to social media use, a "Come Experience Lancaster's Best Small Park" Banner was proposed. A Birthday Carnival was suggested for the summer.

The **Growth Task Force** is developing a plan to contact new homeowners in a 3 mile radius of the church inviting them to worship and programs at Church of Apostles.

Old Business: Christa asked if members had begun to do the 4 calls to church members suggested at last month's meeting.

New Business: Council member's names were put in a hat, and drawn. Calls to the chosen member are to be completed before the next meeting.

Preparation for next meeting: Read <u>Be The Church.</u> Complete the "purple page" p. 15.


