CHURCH OF THE APOSTLES COUNCIL MINUTES March 18, 2019

Present: Christa Conrad, Betsy Bischoff, Delaney Breslin, John Eshbach, Bernie Fickes, Herb Forrey, Todd Harris, Marty Holmes, Linda Lewis, Stephanie Moore. Mark Reinhardt, Andy Smith, Kathy Kuhn, Ex Officio. **Excused:** Donna Carr, Barbara Achtermann, Jeannie Clausen

Call to Order: 7:01 pm by Christa Conrad, President **Devotions:** Bernie Fickes led devotions and prayer. **Minutes:** A correction was made in the Pastor's Report concerning Dan's upcoming schedule. "He has a trip to Israel in May for a cross cultural experience and CPE (Clinical Practical Experience) in another setting for June, July, and August."

The minutes for the February 18, 2019 meeting were amended as above and then approved on motion by Todd Harris and seconded by John Eshbach.

Treasurer's Report: Andy Smith reported that the finances are continuing to hold steady through the winter. Deficit is still continuing at around \$11,000.

Commission Reports:

MPC: Did not meet in March. Minutes in packet from Feb. 18, 2019. Meetings are scheduled for June 17 and September 16 at 6 pm.

Education: as in packet.

Outreach: as in packet. Minutes from Feb. meeting.

Did not meet in March.

Parish Life: as in packet. Clara Kosmela requested reminding members about the Garage Sale scheduled for April 26 and 27. Helping hands are needed to cashier on

those days and to set up, sort, and price items earlier in the week.

Property: Herb Forry explained the anticipated arrangement with the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay for planting trees in Rader Park. The April 13 proposed planting has been postponed until further decisions are made about the number and location of trees. The Commission members will be meeting with Ryan Davis of the Alliance to do an evening walk-though in the Park resulting in an exact arrangement between the Church and the Alliance. Other items were included in the packet and/or discussed under New Business.

Stewardship: as in packet, and Treasurer's report. **Worship:** As in packet.

Pastor's Report – as in packet. Packet contains reports from both Kathy and Dan. Kathy discussed several items as listed under New Business.

Old Business: None to report.

New Business: Kathy introduced for discussion the following items: (1) A request through Jen Eaton for a "Training for Trainers" program by Team River Runners organization, in cooperation with Vision Corp, to use church facilities and Rader Park for one week in Aug. This group gets people with visual disabilities to get into kayaks to go out on water. Approximately 15 people would be setting up a tent camp at Rader Park, using the pavilion and Youth Center, and the kitchen in the church during the week (dates to be determined). Council members enthusiastically discussed how this type of activity furthers the mission of our congregation and agreed for Kathy to proceed with planning.

(2) Kathy presented the following, requesting that Council members pray for guidance as we consider how God may be leading us. The New Beginning Evangelical Church has outgrown the space it is presently using. This is the group that joined us for our memorable Thanksgiving Service this year. Kathy has had preliminary discussions with their pastor as to their needs. At present they use another church's facilities from 3:00 – 6:30 on Sunday afternoons. They would request using our sanctuary during that time for their worship services. Council members shared some prior experiences and raised a number of questions. Kathy repeated her request for discerning if God is calling us to share our space.

Council members agreed to prayerfully consider this information and supported Kathy to continue discussions with their pastor.

(3) Kathy reviewed the results of the survey in "Be the Church" that Council members have been reviewing. The highest consensus score indicated that our focus is on God with a community focus and congregational focus coming in next. This led to our discussion of each Council member being given a name of a church member who attends the opposite service with the intent to contact that person to get to know him/her better. Kathy will give us a name to contact before next Council

meeting. Council members will continue to read and study <u>Be The Church</u>. Herb introduced the following information and proposal:

- 1) Property commission has agreed to have Brooklawn Paving do three separate walkway projects in the area of the pond in Rader Park. The total expenditure will not exceed \$17,000.
- 2) Lapp Electric has worked with Herb and other members of the Property Commission to determine new

lighting for the sanctuary. A proposal from Lapp was presented and approved by the Commission members and then presented to Council. After answering questions and discussing options, Herb made the motion to accept the proposal to replace the halogen sanctuary lights with LED lights and the present dimmer system with a wireless dimmer control system. The amount for the total project is \$86,940.46. John Eshbach seconded the motion. The Council members unanimously

approved the motion.

Central American Relief
Efforts (C.A.R.E) has

southern Honduras from July
21st through the 28th — a
week of providing health care,

gratitude. Three days of medical clinics are currently scheduled, with at least a day for another public service and 1 day available for the group to spend as they determine. First and last days are travel.

To confirm the trip, C.A.R.E. needs 10 people going. Knowing Spanish, medicine or pharmaceuticals is not required—just adaptability to summer climate. Average cost for the week is \$1,000 which includes ALL expenses except airfare. Airfare varies by the day but \$650.00 is average range.



Saying Good-bye to a Link to Our Past

n January, Homestead Village lost another historic icon. Marjorie A. Schellenberger, a long time Homestead Village resident, passed away on the 22nd. She was 98. Mrs. Schellenberger's husband, Nevin, preceded her in death in 2004, shortly after they made Homestead Village their home. It was very appropriate that the Schellenbergers chose to retire to Homestead Village as the community was his brainchild decades earlier.

Nevin Schellenberger was pastoring St. Paul's Church in downtown Lancaster when he dreamed of having a church surrounded by a retirement community and other community agencies. He shared his dream with other like-minded visionaries in Lancaster County and soon found others who believed in his vision. The result was the beautiful Community Way campus, anchored by Church of the Apostles and originally included American Heart Association, American Cancer Society, Easter Seals (now Schreiber Pediatric), Parish Resource Center and Homestead Village.

Acclaimed at the time as an innovative campus focused on serving the community, Community Way has changed over the years; but its original mission as envisioned by Nevin Schellenberger close to fifty years ago remains as ______ strong as ever!



Marjorie and Nevin were married for 59 years. Marjorie graduated from Allentown High School and Cedar Crest College. She taught in Sinking Spring and J.P. McCaskey High Schools for 16 years. She was a member of Church of the Apostles, served as a Committee Women for the Republican Party in Manheim Township, President of the Iris Club, Women's Guild at Church of the Apostles, Meals on Wheels and President of Cedar Crest Club of Lancaster Homestead Village's very existence is a testimony to the faith and hard work of the Schellenberger family. We will miss Marjorie Schellenberger.
